

Visiting Columbus

Because there is no shortage of lodging options in Columbus across a range of prices, we have not made any prearrangements for the meeting. Instead we have compiled this list of possibilities. We have not taken account of private rentals; no doubt there are many available.

Hockey fans are in luck. The Columbus Blue Jackets have home games all weekend: Thursday March 14 (Ottawa); Saturday March 16 (San Jose); and Sunday March 17 (Winnipeg). For football fans—No! Not that football! The real football!—MLS defending champions Columbus Crew have a home match on Saturday March 16 versus the New York Red Bulls at their new lower.com stadium.

Those of you who want to take advantage of Columbus's many urban amenities and might want to stay in the Short North-Downtown-Arena District areas should be mindful that those areas are likely to be crowded and lively on Saturday. Hotel rooms might be hard to come by if you wait, and rates may be higher than usual.

Campus Area

Blackwell Inn (\$200)

Ohio State University owned, on-campus. Just a stroll across campus, the Blackwell is the closest to OAH meeting areas. Nearby eating options, however, are mostly fast-food chains and pizza.

Short North

The Short North is Columbus's arts & night life district. It is set up for pedestrians. You'll find many excellent restaurants, interesting arts galleries and shopping. It is a direct shot to campus on High St., though you should know that the city has choked High St. down to one lane in each direction up to the campus area, and there is constant construction as well. If driving to and from campus, use Neil Ave. or Fourth Street instead. It is a bit more than a two-mile walk, not unpleasant in good weather.
